#### Operation Inherent Resolve – destroying ISIL in Iraq & Syria

The Coalition continued to degrade the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant on multiple fronts, assisting Iraqi Security Forces with the liberation of eastern Mosul and enabling Syrian Democratic Forces to encircle Raqqa as they dismantle ISIL's self-proclaimed capital in Syria. The January Airpower Summary showcases the Coalition's efforts to overwhelm ISIL in its last major strongholds, conducting precision engagements and releasing the most ordnance by Combined Forces Air Component Commander assets in a single month since Operation Inherent Resolve began.

ISIL continues to lose territory and resources to enable its means of war. In Iraq, the Coalition has liberated 60% of ISIL-held territory. The terrorist organization is backpedaling as the Coalition makes a concerted effort to degrade the organization's network in Mosul. In Syria, Coalition efforts to isolate and pressure Raqqa continue. Raqqa represents the nexus of ISIL's external operations. The Coalition continues to enable the Syrian Democratic Force, conducting strikes to disrupt the enemy, while Raqqa is being isolated. In January, CFACC-controlled aircraft released more than 3,600 weapons against ISIL targets in both Iraq and Syria. This included 8 strikes against command and control assets, 156 strikes against illicit oil resources used to finance ISIL operations and 28 strikes against ISIL leadership and headquarters infrastructure.

Through our operations, the Coalition has degraded ISIL's fighters on the front lines. We've disrupted their command and control apparatus and imposed an incredible strain on their leaders, industrial base, financial systems and communication networks. Coalition air operations remain focused on enabling ground forces to dismantle ISIL's advance and re-establish control over territory.

Under the NATO Resolute Support Mission, the Afghan Air Force continues to regenerate capability and capacity during the winter campaign. This month, 44 Afghan Air Force C-130 Hercules maintainers were the first to be trained in-country, graduating as certified maintainers. The certifications were the culmination of six months of training with Coalition maintenance air advisors. The maintainers will support a critical C-130H airframe in the AAF, which has flown more than 1,065 sorties and transported over 29,900 passengers and 880,000 metric tons of cargo. In Operation Freedom's Sentinel, members of the 455th Air Expeditionary Wing received new combat enablers for the 774th Expeditionary Airlift Squadron with Airmen of 39th Airlift Squadron from Dyess Air Force Base, replacing the 41st Airlift Squadron from Little Rock Air

Force Base. Jalalabad Airfield also achieved a milestone by landing a C-17 Globemaster III on its flightline for the first time

since 2010. The C-17 delivered Mine Resistant Ambush Protected (MRAP) vehicles to support the mission in theater.
