

Airpower Effects

The Coalition concluded a milestone year with several significant strikes against ISIL resources and captured weaponry in December, dealing a substantial blow to the terrorist organization's ability to finance and enable its means of war.

In Operation Inherent Resolve, the air campaign intensified against ISIL's oil-production and distribution network. The Coalition launched its largest strike of the year, wiping out 188 ISIL oil tankers, depriving the organization of more than \$2 million in illicit oil sales. The Coalition also systematically targeted ISIL's efforts to procure abandoned weaponry as their military capabilities continue to be degraded by persistent pressure from the Coalition. During a mid-month strike, the Coalition struck ISIL-seized military hardware to include tanks and artillery systems. In Iraq, Iraqi Security Forces maintained their focus to liberate Mosul. Depriving ISIL of its safe haven in Mosul is central to putting the organization on a path to a lasting defeat. In Syria, the Syrian Democratic Forces have made significant advances in their march toward Raqqa. Since the Raqqa offensive, the SDF has liberated dozens of villages and more than 700 miles of ISIL-held terrain. Coalition airstrikes and ISR assets continue to play a crucial role in the offensive, assisting our Syrian partners with pushing ISIL back and destroying heavy weapons, vehicles, fortifications and IED facilities.

In Operation Resolute Support and Freedom's Sentinel, the Afghan Air Force has focused heavily on training during their winter campaign. This month, Afghan Air Force tactical air controllers participated in a live-fire exercise with Resolute Support coalition members. The exercise emphasized air-to-ground integration with Afghan MD-530 helicopters, which serve as critical close air support platforms that enable ANDSF operations. Under Operation Freedom's Sentinel, members of the 455th Air Expeditionary Wing successfully conducted a pararescue and aeromedical evacuation exercise. The exercise tested the adaptation of C-130J aircraft to assist in rapid recovery of isolated personnel in remote places of Afghanistan, which enhances capability and increases the chance of saving lives during search and rescue missions.

The Coalition remains vigilant in its pursuit to eliminate resources that enable Da'esh to continue its efforts of terror within the region and around the world.

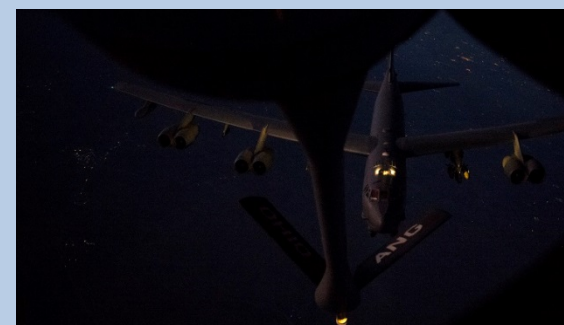
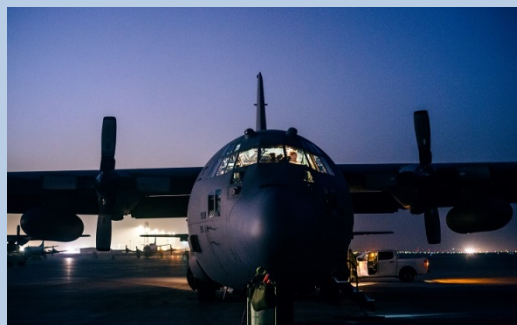
