Welcome Letter

Welcome to USCENTCOM Forward Headquarters (CFH) at Al Udeid Airbase (AUAB). CFH on AUAB in Qatar was first put into operation and occupied by HQ USCENTCOM in the Fall of 2009 and has been in continuous use since that time. Qatar funded and conducted the construction project that built the CFH facilities, with HQ USCENTCOM and select mission partners then outfitting and equipping the facilities to meet operational requirements. Prior to utilizing the current CFH, from 2003-2009, HQ USCENTCOM utilized a more expeditionary CFH that was located on Camp As-Saliyah in Qatar.

CFH provides HQ USCENTCOM with robust operational, planning, coordination and command and control capabilities that are positioned in the CENTCOM AOR, supported by AFCENT who provides Base Operating Support (BOS) on AUAB. CFH also provides for lodging capabilities that are within walking distance of the operational HQ facilities. A base dining facility, fitness center, and base exchange facilities as well as emergency medical support capabilities are all within a very short drive or walking distance from the CFH facilities

Key Leader Biography

General Michael E. Kurilla

Commander, United States Central Command

General Michael “Erik” Kurilla is from Elk River, Minnesota and commissioned into the Infantry from the United States Military Academy, West Point in 1988. Throughout his career, he has led Airborne, Mechanized, Stryker, Ranger and Joint Special Operations units during combat and operational deployments including Operation Just Cause (Panama), Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm (Saudi Arabia/Iraq), Operation Uphold Democracy (Haiti), Operation Joint Guardian (Kosovo-Macedonia), Operation Joint Resolve (Bosnia-Herzegovina), Operation Iraqi Freedom (Iraq), Operation Enduring Freedom (Afghanistan), and Operation Inherent Resolve (Iraq). General Kurilla spent every year from 2004 - 2014 leading conventional and special operations forces in the U.S. Central Command Area of Responsibility.



General Kurilla previously commanded 1st Battalion, 24th Infantry (Stryker), 2nd Ranger Battalion, the 75th Ranger Regiment, the 82nd Airborne Division, and the XVIII Airborne Corps.

In addition to command assignments as a General Officer, General Kurilla served as the Director of Operations and Assistant Commanding General for Joint Special Operations Command, Deputy Commanding General for the 1st Infantry Division, Joint Staff Deputy Director for Special Operations and Counter-Terrorism, and Chief of Staff for U.S. Central Command.

General Kurilla’s awards and decorations include the Combat Infantryman Badge with Star, Master Parachutist Badge with Combat Jump Device, Ranger Tab, and the Purple Heart with Oak Leaf Cluster. He holds a B.S. in Aerospace Engineering from the United States Military Academy, West Point; an M.B.A from Regis University; and a M.S. in National Security Studies from the National War College.

General Kurilla and his wife Mary Paige have two daughters.

Key Leader Biography

Lieutenant General Gregory M. Guillot

Deputy Commander, United States Central Command

Lt. Gen. Gregory M. Guillot received his commission in 1989 from the U.S. Air Force Academy. He also holds a Master in Aeronautical Science from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University and a Master of Strategic Studies from the National War College. He has commanded a flying squadron, operations group, two flying wings, and a Numbered Air Force, including the 965th Airborne Air Control Squadron, 380th Expeditionary Operations Group, 552nd Air Control Wing, 55th Wing, and Ninth Air Force (Air Forces Central).



He has served on Numbered Air Force, major command, Headquarters Air Force, and combatant command staffs, and was an Air Force Weapons School instructor. As a General Officer, his previous assignments include Director of Strategic Plans, Requirements, and Programs, Headquarters Pacific Air Forces, Chief of Staff, Headquarters Pacific Air Forces, Deputy Commander, U.S. Air Forces Central Command; Deputy Combined Force Air Component Commander, U.S. Central Command, Director of Operations, Headquarters U.S. Northern Command, Commander, Ninth Air Force (Air Forces Central), and Combined Force Air Component Commander, U.S. Central Command.

His personal decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal with oak leaf cluster, Defense Superior Service Medal with two oak leaf clusters, Legion of Merit with oak leaf cluster, Bronze Star Medal with two oak leaf clusters, Meritorious Service Medal with silver and bronze oak leaf clusters, Air Medal, Aerial Achievement Medal, Air Force Commendation Medal Army Commendation Medal, Air Force Achievement Medal with oak leaf cluster.

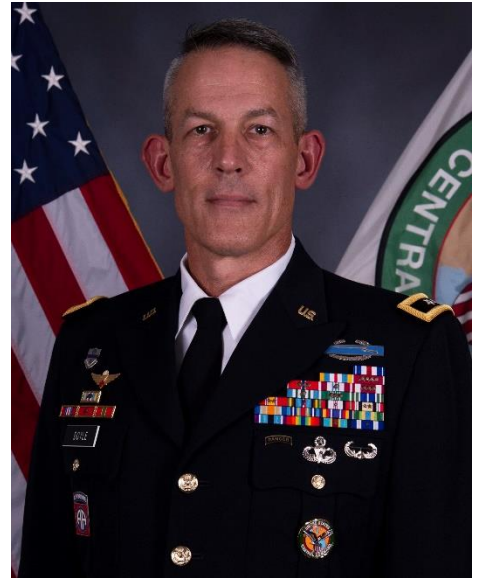
The General is a senior air battle manager with more than 1,380 flying hours in E-3B/C/G and RC-135V/W/S aircraft.

Major General David S. Doyle

Chief of Staff, United States Central Command

Major General Doyle, from West Point, New York, received his Army commission from the United States Military Academy at West Point in 1993. He is currently serving as the Chief of Staff for United States Central Command.



Throughout his career, he has led infantry forces at every level. His past assignments include Deputy Commanding General for Support of the 82nd Airborne Division; Director of Operations, CJ3, Combined Joint Task Force, Operation Inherent Resolve in Baghdad, Iraq; Commander of Operations Group at the Joint Readiness Training Center at Fort Polk, Louisiana; Chief of Staff of the 7th Infantry Division; Commander of the 2nd Infantry Brigade Combat Team “Commandos”, 10th Mountain Division deployed in Kandahar, Afghanistan; Director of Operations, CJ3, for the NATO Special Operations Component Command – Afghanistan / Special Operations Joint Task Force – Afghanistan; Commander of the 2nd Battalion, 325th Airborne Infantry Regiment, 82nd Airborne Division; company commander of Bravo Company, 3rd Ranger Battalion and Bravo Company, 2-325th Airborne Infantry Regiment, and Commanding General of the Joint Readiness Training Center and Fort Polk.

Major General Doyle is a graduate of the Command and General Staff College, the School of Advanced Military Studies, and the National War College in Washington, DC.

His awards include the Silver Star Medal, Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star Medal, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal with arrowhead device, the Combat Infantryman’s Badge, the Expert Infantryman’s Badge, Air Assault Badge, Master Parachutist Badge with Bronze Service Star, Canadian Parachutist Badge, and the Ranger Tab.

Fleet Master Chief Derrick "Wally" A. Walters

Senior Enlisted Leader, United States Central Command

Fleet Master Chief Derrick A. Walters spent a majority of his childhood growing up in NYC but then moved to western PA and was a 1987 graduate of Johnstown Vo-Tech H.S. In August 1987 he enlisted in the Navy and attended boot camp at Naval Recruit Training Center, Orlando, FL. Upon completion of recruit training and Intelligence Specialist "A" school, Fleet Master Chief Walters entered the UDT/SEAL pipeline and successfully completed Basic Underwater Demolition/ SEAL Training, Class 154 in October 1988.



His previous duty stations include a tour of duty at SEAL Team EIGHT, Naval Special Warfare Group TWO, SEAL Team TWO, Naval Special Warfare Group TWO Training Detachment, a repeat tour at SEAL Team TWO as the Operations Master Chief then Command Master Chief, a repeat tour at Naval Special Warfare Group TWO Training Detachment as the Senior Enlisted Advisor, Command Master Chief for Naval Special Warfare Center, Coronado CA, Command Senior Enlisted Leader for NATO Special Operations HQ, Mons, Belgium, Force Master Chief for Naval Special Warfare Command, Coronado CA, Fleet Master Chief for Naval Forces Europe and Naval Forces Africa, and currently the Fleet Master Chief for United States Central Command.

Academic achievements include a bachelor's degree (Cum Laude) in Liberal Studies from Excelsior College; Senior Enlisted Joint Professional Military Education; Navy Senior Enlisted Academy graduate and City of Newport Academic Excellence Award recipient; Command Master Chief Course graduate; and the National Defense University Keystone course graduate.

Derrick's qualifications include Static Line Jumpmaster, Naval Special Warfare Dive Supervisor, Naval Special Warfare Sniper, Military Free Fall parachutist, Open and Closed-Circuit Diver, Small Arms Instructor, Range Officer In-Charge, Emergency Medical Technician, U. S. Army Protective Services graduate, Naval Special Warfare Communicator, U.S. Army CBR Instructor, and Helicopter Rope Suspension Trainer.

ELECTRICAL SAFETY

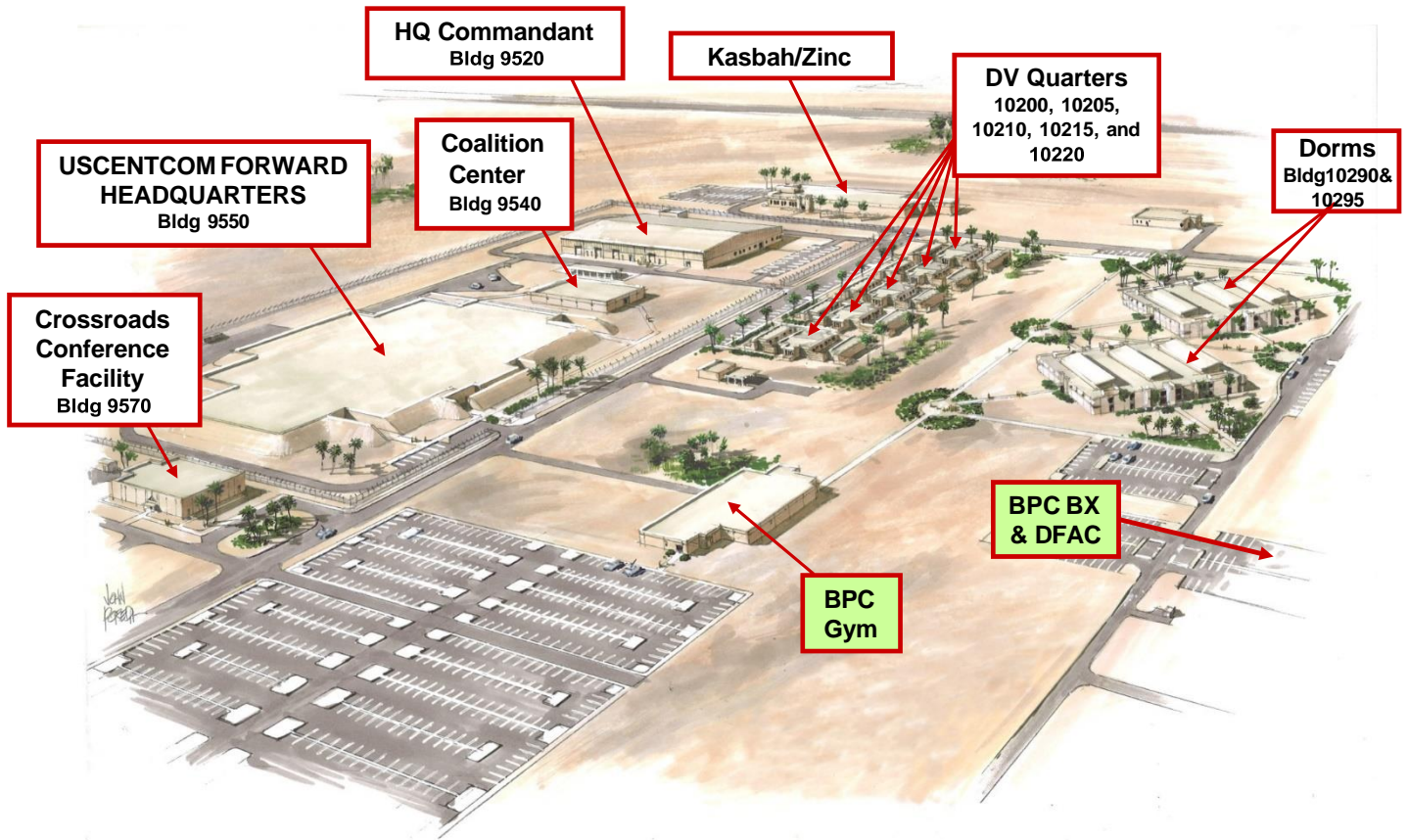

Within walking distance...

The USCENTCOM Forward HQ campus is located within the Blatchford-Preston Complex (BPC), adjacent to the BPC Gym, the Kasbah Club, and is a short walk down the “yellow brick road” (not pictured) to the nearest Dining Facility (BPC DFAC), and Base Exchange (BX) containing dining options, Barber Shop, recreation center, post office and an ATM.

Just north of the BPC, at the other end of the yellow brick road, is the Coalition Compound (CC) where you will find the track, a gym, movie theater, sports lounges, BX, an outdoor food-court (with Subway, Burger King, Dunkin Donuts, and Baskin Robbins), and recreational pool collocated with a Dairy Queen, as well as Memorial Plaza, which hosts outdoor entertainment and social functions, and many base support functional offices.

GRAB-AND-GOs

Al Udeid has two Grab-and-Go kitchens as well as commercial fast-food options. The Cold Grab-and-Go is just north of the Passenger Terminal and is open 24-hours. The “Kitchen” Hot Grab-and-Go is located across from the Wing Operations Center (WOC) and is open 24-hours.

BPC GYM

The BPC gym is open 24-hours and offers aerobic and weightlifting classes. Class and pool hours vary and are posted inside the gym.

RUNNING GUIDANCE

You are permitted to run on the paved roads and sidewalks in the Coalition Compound (CC) and Blatchford-Preston Complex (BPC) except for high-traffic portions of Enduring Freedom Road marked with “No Running Beyond This Point” signs.
