

SUBJECT: Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Force Health Protection Measures

1. As we continue to actively fight through COVID-19, our priorities remain unchanged: Protect the Force, Prevent the Spread and Ensure Mission Success. IAW Ref (a) and (b), USAFCENT will maintain full spectrum capability and freedom of movement of assigned air forces. Al Udeid Air Base is currently in HPCON Bravo.
2. Our best tools in the fight against COVID-19 are social distancing, wearing your mask and good personal hygiene. Attachment 1 provides a list of specific measures in effect for all personnel on AUAB to include Command Sponsor Program (CSP) dependents. Effective immediately, failure to comply with these restrictions are subject to UCMJ Article 92. 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AUAB COVID-19

Force Health Protection Measures

Current as of 8 October 2020

1. IAW Ref (b), take all necessary precautions to prevent the spread:
 - a. Limit social behaviors such as hand-shaking, physical contact, and visits to any locations other than work centers and personal living quarters
 - b. Increase washing of hands and clothing
 - c. Increase deep cleaning of living quarters, bathrooms and work centers
 - d. Social distancing of six (6) feet, per the Centers for Disease Control (CDC)
2. Masks (covering both mouth and nose) must be worn in all common areas where two or more personnel gather:
 - a. The entire BPC Mall Complex (not just the BX), to include the post office, barber shop, etc.
 - b. Anywhere a line forms inside or outside, to include DFACs and Grab and Go's (social distancing still required unless impossible)
 - c. More than one person in a vehicle (busses included)
 - d. In all fitness facilities at all times (transiting the gym, spotting, stretching, retrieving weights, wiping down equipment after use, etc.) expect during periods of physical exertion (cardio machines, lifting weights, push/ups/sit-ups, etc.)
 - e. During all Chapel services
 - f. All work centers where safe to do so (unless in single person office)
3. IAW Ref (b), all off base travel is prohibited. (*Note: 'Off-base' at the north gate means passing to the north side of the checkpoint where U.S. Security Forces scans IDs and takes temperatures*). Personnel who currently reside off base are exempt but must avoid contact with the local population. Requests for mission essential off-base travel must be signed by the first O-6 in the chain of command indicating the off base travel is mission essential. The signed request will be sent to the 379 AEW AUAB COVID Command and Control Team (AC3) via 379AEW.CAT@auab.afcent.af.mil for action. Allow 24 hours for a response to your request. For Emergency requests, contact the AC3 at DSN: 455-5000 or cellphone: +974 5080-4060.
4. IAW Ref (b), while we are in HPCON B, *unit events are limited to 50 or less (mask-wearing) personnel and must be approved by the squadron commander (or equivalent); events of 51, or more (mask-wearing) personnel must be approved by 379 AEW/CAT.*
5. Dining Facility (DFAC) modifications:
 - a. Take-out food is highly encouraged; DFACs will maximize this capability
 - b. Seating capacity will be limited to maximize social distancing
6. Cancellations and closures: MWR events
7. Leaders should take measures to protect vital team such as scheduling in teams where feasible to limit contact with others enabling continued operations.
8. Main base population personnel are prohibited from contacting personnel through a Q-Town or T-Town fence line even if masks and 6' of distancing is kept. Do not pass anything through, under or over the fence and do not speak with anyone through the fence. Any contact by main base personnel with quarantined or transient personnel must be done through the admin tent/entry control point. 9. All units assigned/operating on AUAB are required to notify the 379 AEW AC3 (email/phone above) when a person in their unit is directed to quarantine/isolate by medical authorities other than 379 EMDG (i.e., off-base medical providers). The purpose of this requirement is to ensure 379 EMDG awareness of notification, the commander, supervisor, or contract representative can also request approval to quarantine or isolate personnel off

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base. This reporting requirement is retroactive to 1 August 2020, i.e., past cases not previously reported since 1 August 2020 must be reported.

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
